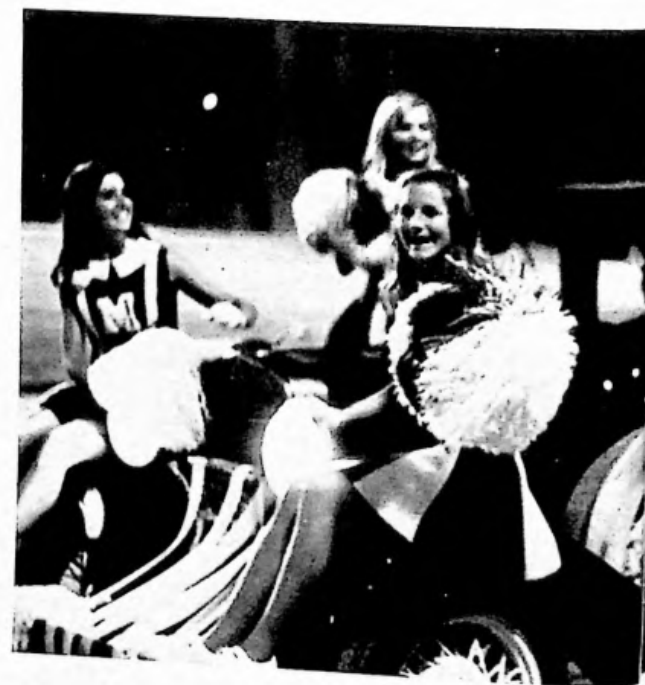
The XIV Olympiad

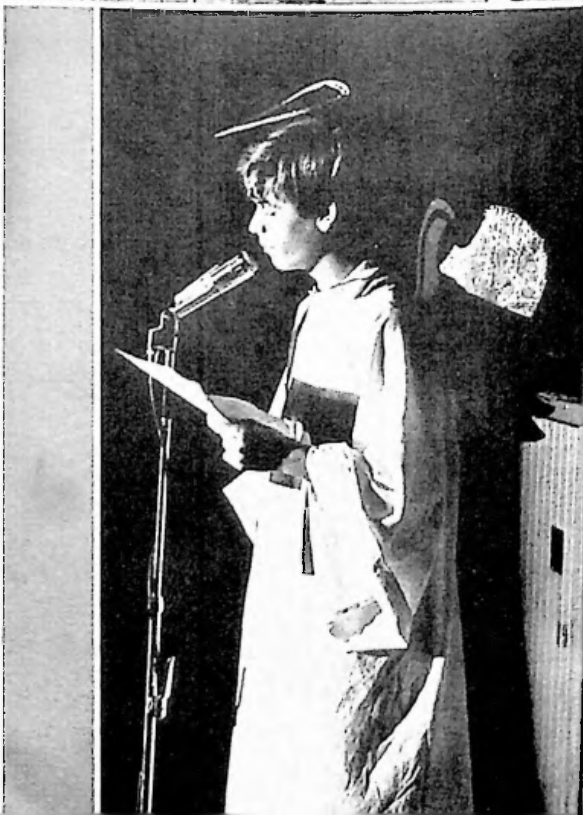
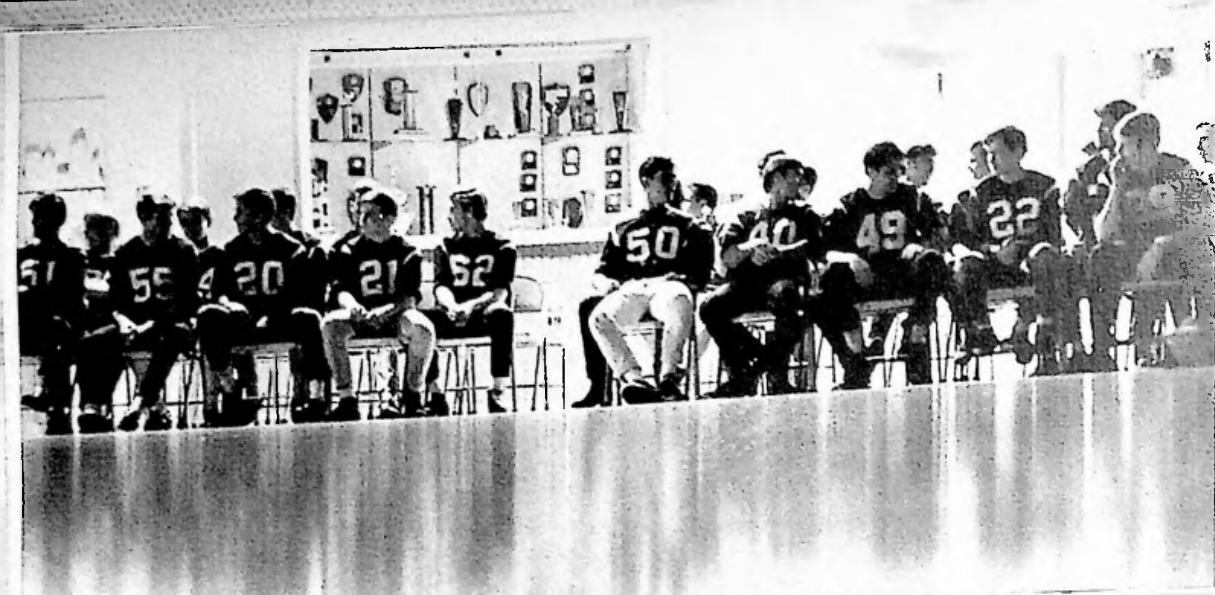


Donkeys Prove Four Legs Better Than Two

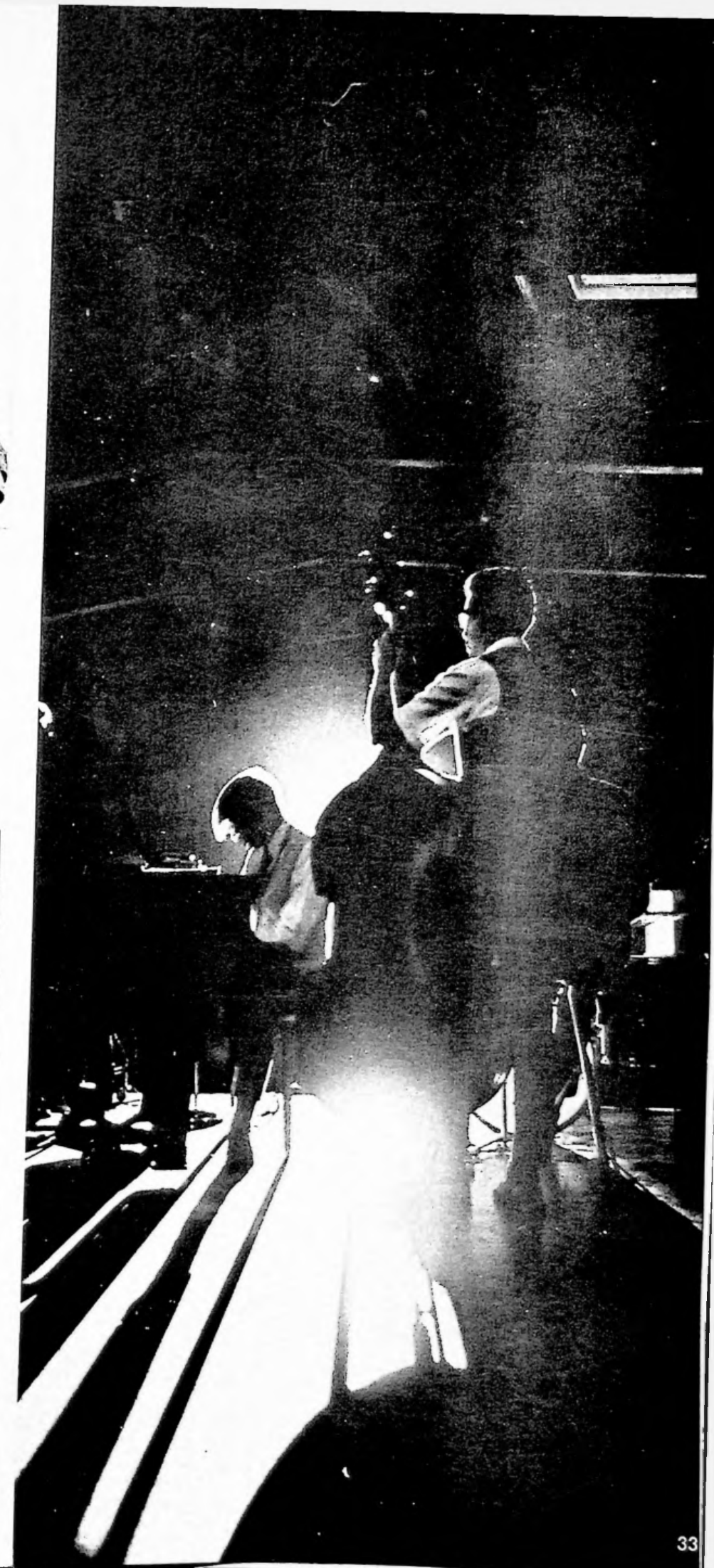




Assemblies Are a Welcome Break

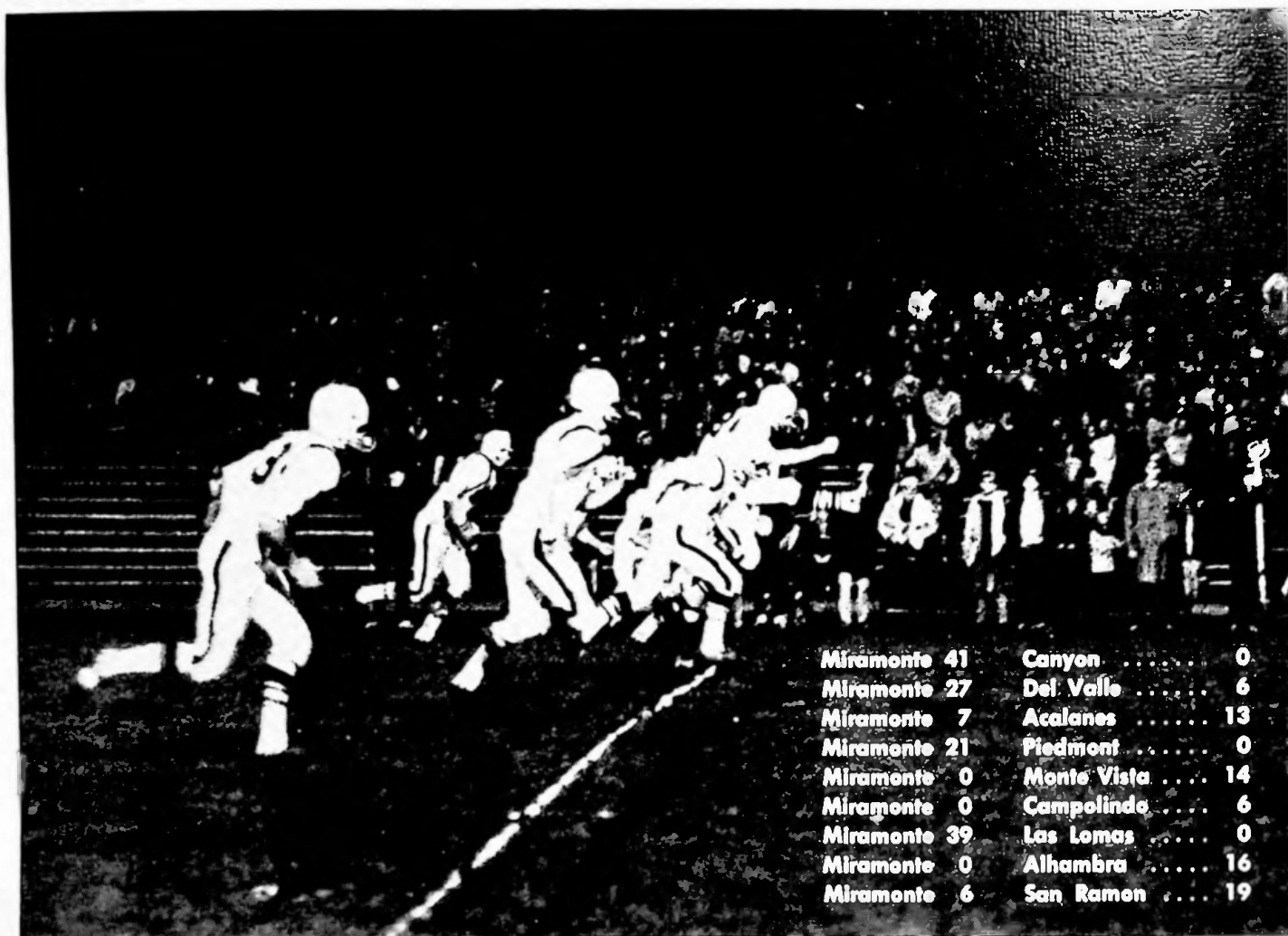

Three interceptions by Acalanes in the first half halted Mat drives; then a week later, on two consecutive drives against Monte Vista, Mat ball carriers fumbled within ten yards of paydirt, and our high East Bay rating plummeted. The highlight of the remainder of the season was the 39-0 trouncing of Los Lomas in the Festival game.

Co-Captains Jim Horning and Larry Reid were among the All-League selections from Miramonte, a tribute to their leadership as well as to their football talents.

In 1968 for the second successive year, Miramonte's Varsity Water Polo team remained undefeated in League competition. The team also defeated two college teams, including the Cal Frosh team, in pre-season contests. Largely due to the efforts of Coach Brown, the team participated in a post-season invitational tournament with more than twenty of the top northern California teams. By winning two of the four games they played, the Mats placed seventh, an outstanding position for a team from a school where water polo has only been played for two years.

Team captain Pete Schnugg, High School All-American and top scorer in the F.A.L., was a unanimous All-League selection, and provided the leadership which made Miramonte a championship team.

Joining Pete in the All-League ranks were Junior Randy Williams, second leading League scorer, and Sophomore Jon Svendsen, both for the second year in a row. Juniors Rick O'Hare and Steve Patching received Honorable Mentions on the All-League team.

Missed It By . . . That Much

"That much" was the one game that separated Miramonte's Varsity basketball team from the F.A.L. Championship in 1969. The Mats proved they were the best in the League, defeating first place San Ramon by 26 points in the final encounter of the season. But inconsistency marred the record with losses to lower-division teams. An early loss by only one point to Del Valle and second round loss to last-place Monte Vista cost the Mats a first-place finish. The heart-break of the season was a double-overtime two-point loss to San Ramon due in part to two controversial calls by the referees in the overtime periods.

The season had its good points, highlighted by the destruction of San Ramon in the second game. Outstanding individual performances resulted in single game point outputs of 25 for Bob Bahme, 21 for Dave Wallace and Pete Schnugg, and 17 for Steve Hale. The back court of Pete Schnugg and "quarterback" Bob Billings led the team in assists and co-ordinated a fine team effort. Pete Wolfe and Larry Reid provided depth and muscle when they were needed.

At the end of the season the team voted Bob Bahme Most Valuable Player; Bob Billings, Best Defensive Player; and Pete Schnugg and Steve Hale, Co-Captains. For his fine performances in the Aker Tournament, Pete Schnugg was named to the All-Tournament team.

The League showed its respect for Miramonte's Varsity by placing four Matador players in the All-League teams. Bob Bahme made first team; Pete Schnugg made second team, and Steve Hale and Dave Wallace received Honorable Mentions.

Coach Tom Blackwood is looking forward to next year when he will be working with the products of the championship J.V. and Frosh teams coached by Bill Brown and Bob Harris. Thanks are due to Chuck Gedney, this year's competent manager.



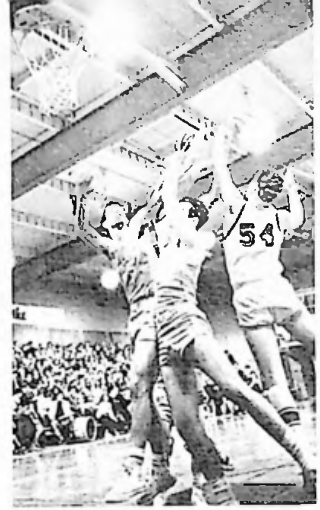


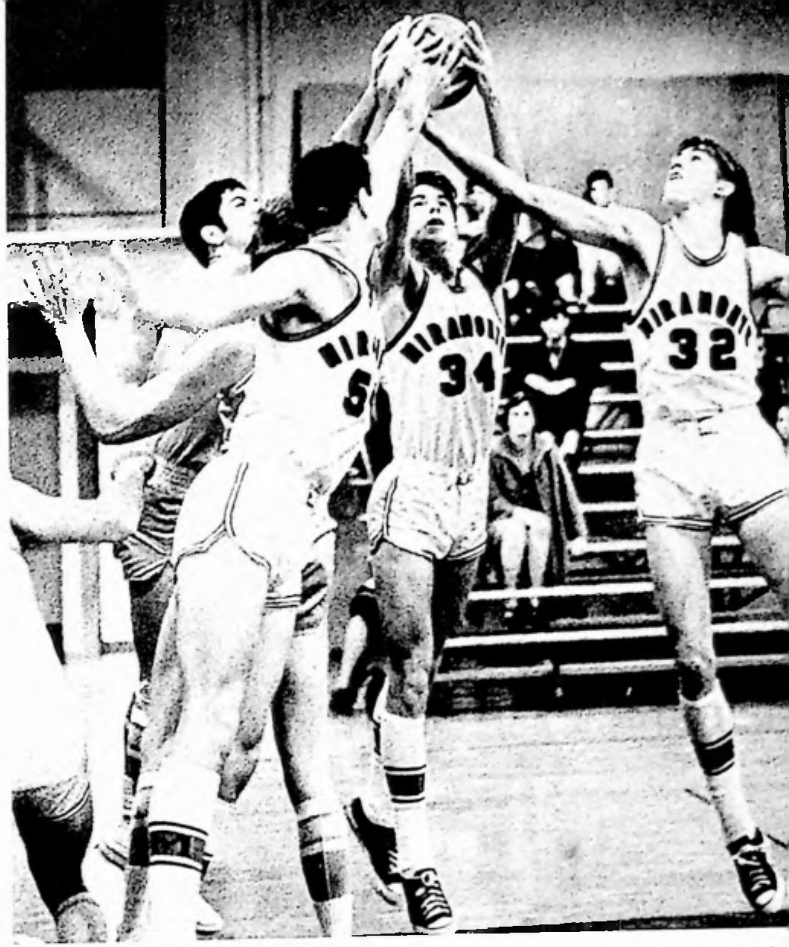
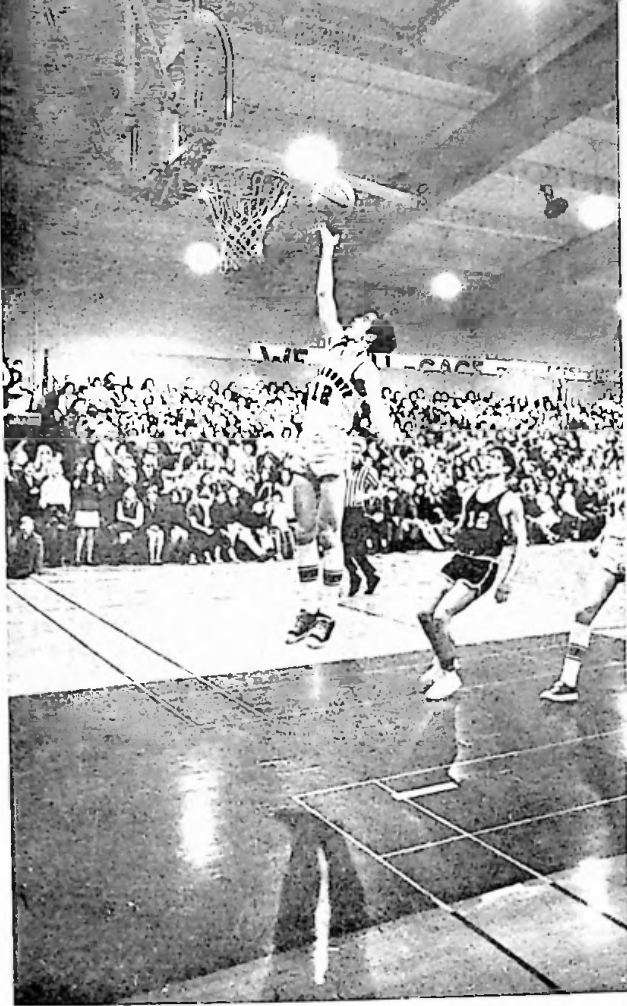

The 1968-69 Varsity Wrestling team was the best ever seen at Miramonte. The team's fine record was due to the efforts of the entire team. As a team the wrestlers won three of the four tournaments they entered, the Hollister, Del Valle, and Overfelt Invitational Tournaments. They also placed fourth at the Cal Poly tournament, there competing against the top teams in northern California. The team also went undefeated in F.A.L. dual meet competition, winning the League championship, then going on to win their North Coast Section II meet, and had four wrestlers place high enough to qualify for State competition.

Many outstanding performances highlighted the season, such as Steve Snow's come-from-behind win against Acalanes to clinch the League championship. Several wrestlers received post-season awards for their achievements. Team Captain Chuck Manuel won the Brian McCarthy Memorial Wrestling Award. Bob Sage was picked as the outstanding wrestler of 1969. Bob was also Super Sport of the Week and won the Elks' Club Outstanding Wrestler award. Jim Horning placed in every tournament, often wrestling above his weight class. Roger Lyford and Casey Manfrin also performed consistently throughout the season. Jim Horning and Roger Lyford placed fourth in their respective weight classes in the State meet. The team received the Rotary Club Undefeated Trophy for their League record.

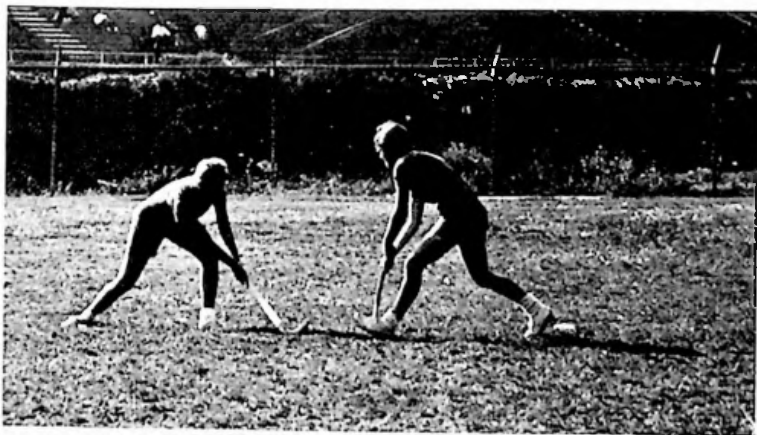
The able supervision of sponsors Miss McPheeters, Miss Neff, and Mrs. Berris helps all interested girls achieve personal satisfaction in sports.

American Field Service Promotes World Friendship

Interview with Bruce

Question: Where did you live in Finland?

"In several places—among them Kolmiranta, about 30 miles from Helsinki, and Lapeenranta, a country home about 200 Km. northwest of Helsinki, near the largest lake in Finland. This home was filled with old country furnishings such as a spinning wheel, wooden utensils, and a red brick oven."

Question: Will you describe your host family?

"There were the parents, of course, and my two sisters, Eva 10, and Kati, 15, and my brother, Karl, 16."

Question: What were some of your new experiences?

"I was introduced to eating crayfish, raikka, leipps (black bread), red whortle berries, reindeer meat, fish eggs, and thick cherry soup (not a dessert). I waterskiied for the first time and had my first experience with a sauna, on the traditional days, Wednesday and Saturday."

Question: Did your host family have any questions about America?

"I cleared up some of their misconceptions: Orinda is not near Hollywood California is not always sunny. Politically, people in Finland are very well informed. Assassinations and the war in Viet Nam were the primary reasons for U.S. unpopularity."

Question: Is there anything else you would like to say?

"AFS taught me a lot about myself. It was a learning experience not only for me but for those with whom I came in contact."

In January of last year I arrived in Johannesburg and began my memorable twelve months' stay in South Africa. I was lucky to have two fabulous families. My English-speaking family live on a 6000 acre farm about 120 miles south of Jo'burg. I attended a convent boarding school about 60 miles away with one of my sisters. During the last half of the year, I stayed with an Afrikaans family in the large coastal city of Durban, the Miami of So. Africa. My Afrikaans sister and I attended a large government school where all classes were taught in Afrikaans, the second official language of the Republic. After spending Christmas with our families, the 24 AFSers in So. Africa took a 3 weeks' bus tour of the country. Some of the highlights of my stay were going on a safari, trailing lion, going down in a gold mine, and holding a 127 carat diamond from one of the mines.

The AFS program has given me a fabulous opportunity to live in another country and understand the people and customs better. What a wonderful way to promote peace and understanding among nations!

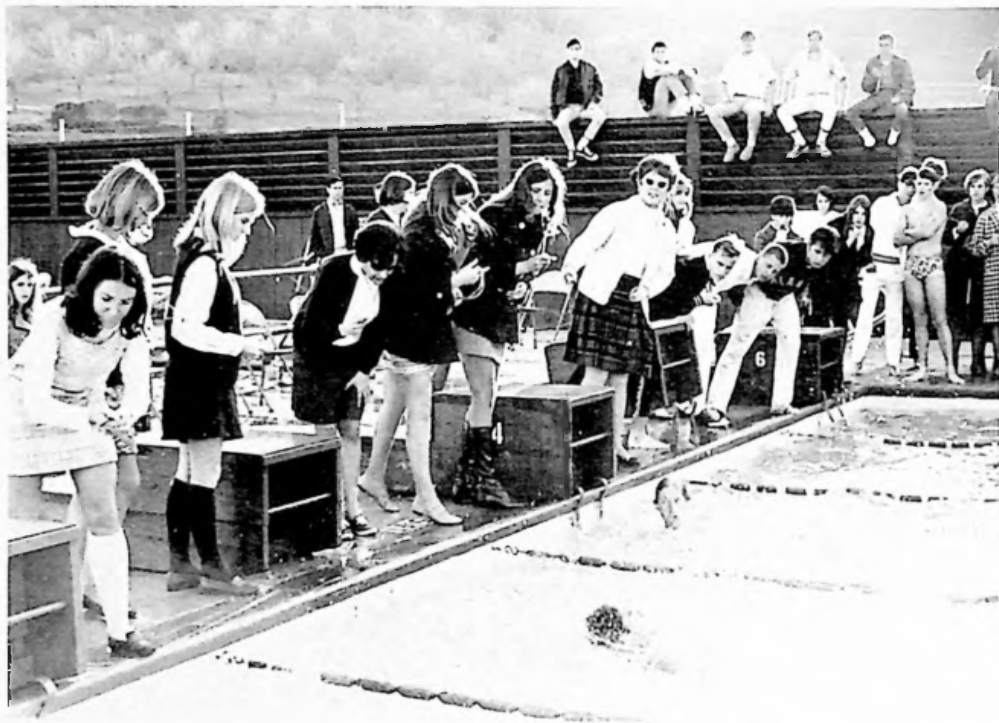

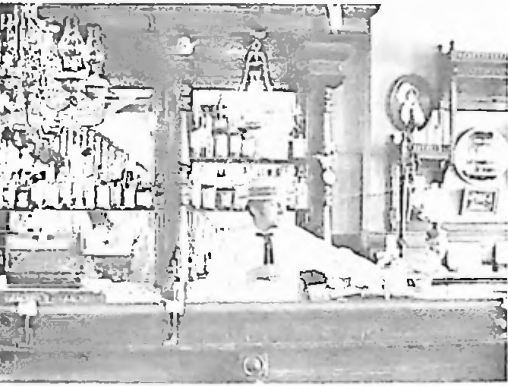

The National Merit Scholarship Program recognizes top academic students all over the country. Any interested student may take the National Merit Qualifying Test in the spring of his junior year and become a Semi-Finalist on the basis of his score. The National Merit Scholarship Corporation determines a cut-off point, which varies from year to year, and students who receive scores above this mark become Semi-Finalists, ranking in the top two percent of the nation's participants in the qualifying test. Finalists are chosen on the basis of their academic record in high school, their extra-curricular activities, and their college board scores. As Finalists, the students are considered for \$1000 Merit Scholarships for one year at the college of their choice or for letters of commendation. Miramonte's total of seventeen Semi-Finalists led the Acalanes School District this year. We are proud of these kids!

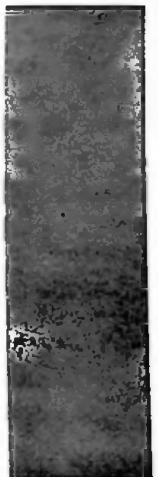
Mr. Lewis Globe-Trots
