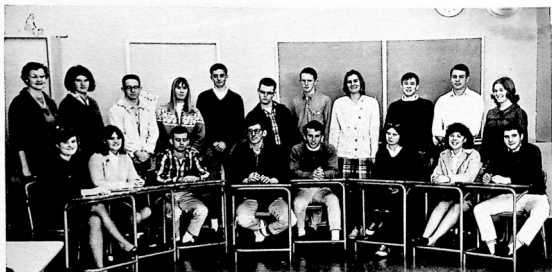

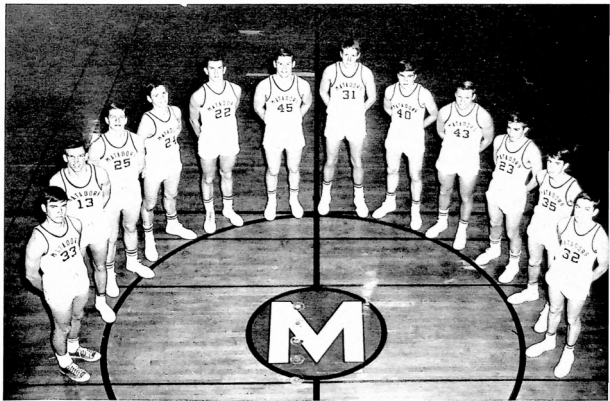
Despite frustrating losses, the Mats had some satisfying victories. In the second half of the season they beat Piedmont, the undefeated league leader.

League honors could be taken by any team this year, and Mr. Guzzo believes that the Mats have an excellent chance of winning the championship.

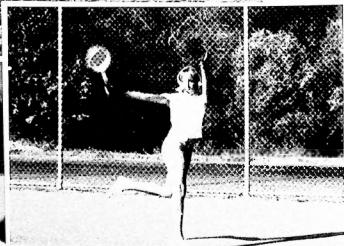

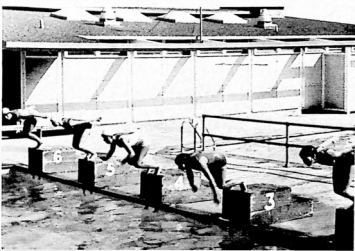
In the girls' sports program this year many girls had the opportunity to participate in swimming, hockey, tennis, basketball, badminton, and softball.

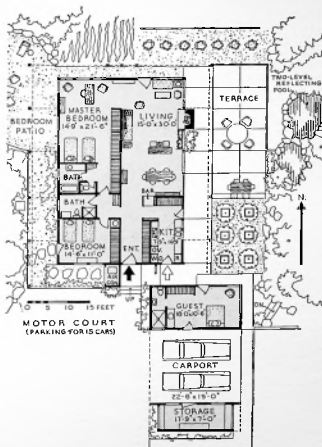

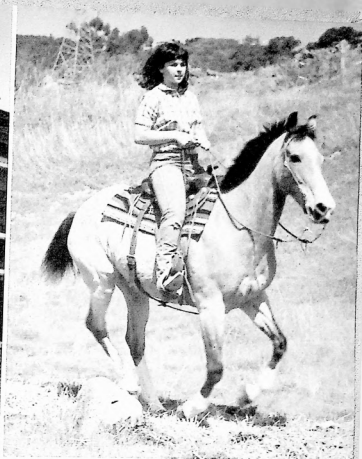

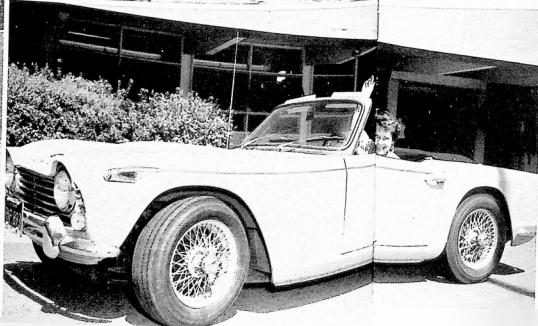
