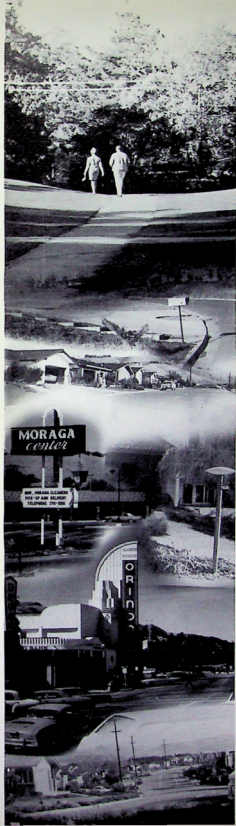

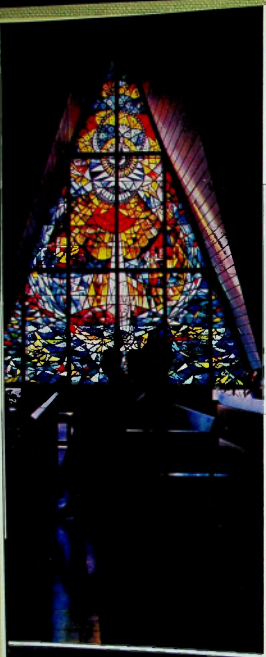
The Junior Chamber of Commerce sponsors an annual community swim meet at Miramonte.

A new group in the community, the Kiwanis Club, welcomes new teachers at a luncheon.

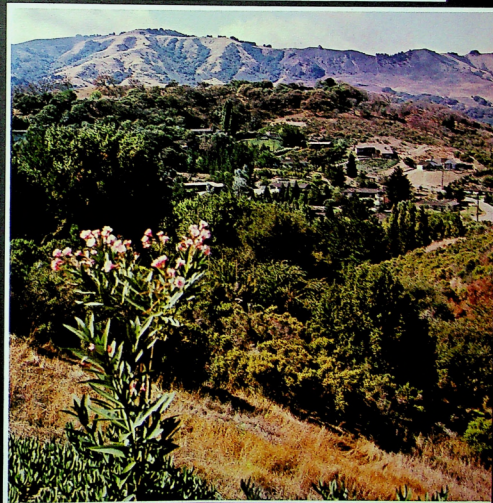

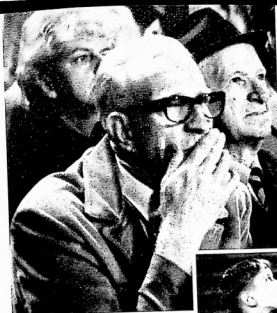

we have a swimming pool available for use by
P.E. classes and school swim teams, as well as
the Aquabears and the Orinda Recreation De-
partment. Under the chairmanship of Mrs. Robert
Bowles, a fund drive raised over \$25,000 toward
the completion of the pool. It was finished and
ready for use on February 1, 1960.

In the spring of 1964 a drive was started for
funds to erect football lights at Miramonte. Mr.
Spencer Archer and the Booster Club organized
the drive; parents and other interested groups
bought bonds and provided jobs for work-week-
ends. In September of 1965 the project was com-
pleted. That fall we played our first game under
the lights.

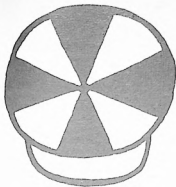

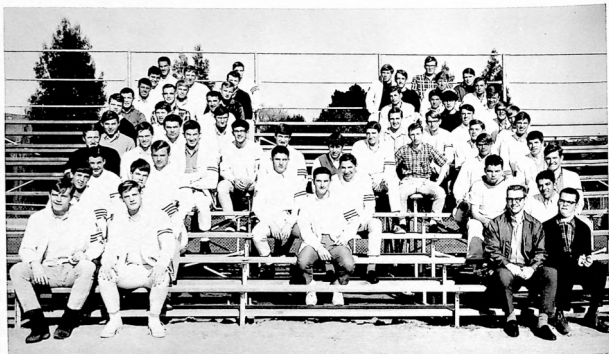


Recognition of Athletic Success

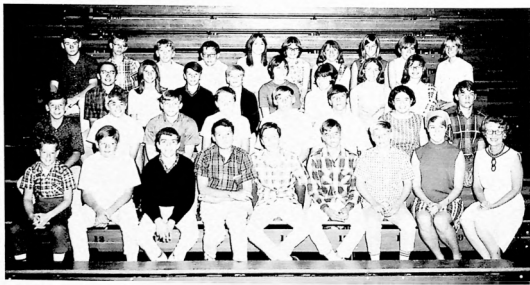

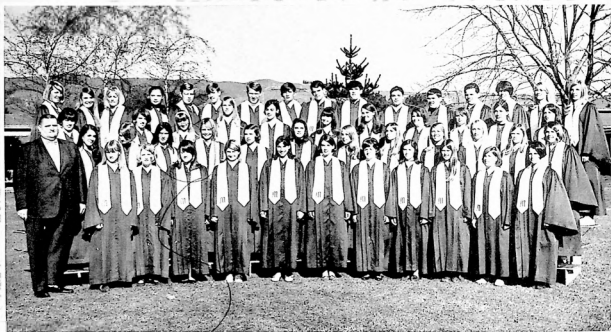
The Hills Are Alive with the Sound of Music

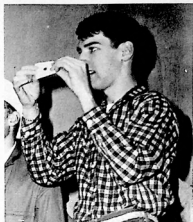

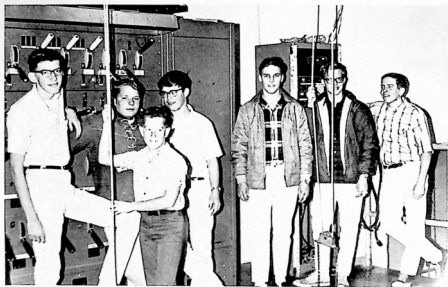
They Seek the Reward of Giving

Representing Miramonte in Girls' Sports,

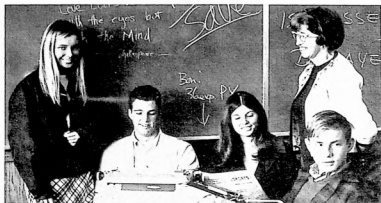

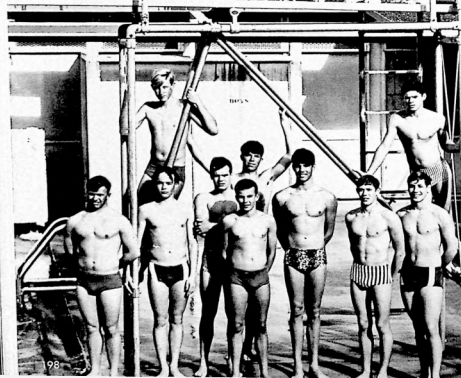

Enthusiasm for the sport and proficiency in the pool led Miramonte Mermen to a very successful championship.

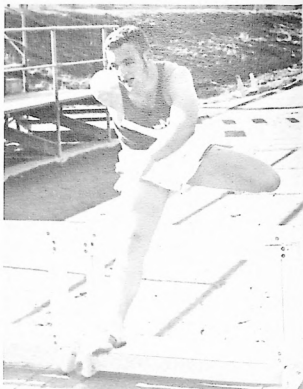

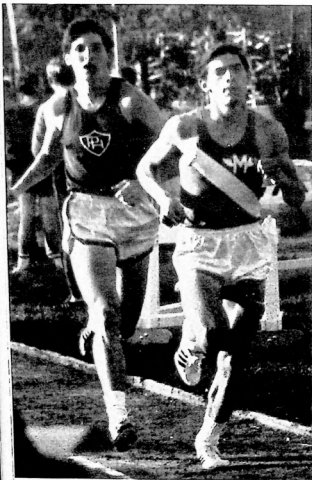
