





In January 1967, I left New York City with 40 other A.F.S. students. We were all for a year of cultural exchange and study in Brasil. My home was in Caxias do Sul, a city of 120,000 people. about 600 miles south of Rio de Janeiro, I lived with the De Carli family, which included my father, a radiologist, my mather, my sister Marta, 21, and my brothers, Alexandre, 20, Guilherme, 15, Jose Inacio, 11. Arriving in Brasil in the sumertime, I had a chance to study Portuguese for 1½ months before classes began in March. I altended class from 4-8 P.M., 6 days a week, and my study was in the scientific field. School lasted until November at which time our tomily soveled to Uruguoy, Sao Paulo and we saw much of the Brazilian countryside. The life of the Brazilian is very different from ours. School is not the center of activities as it is here. Friendships and social activities are found in the social clubs and through the family. 

Sounds of Music


